Orange Varieties and Descriptions

Grove Navels (N)(Seedless*)

Season: November through June

Peel: Smooth, mostly orange although may have some green tint from extra chlorophyll.

Inside: Yellow-orange, sweet and flavorful.

Golden Honeybelles (L) (Usually 6 seeds or less) Mandarin Hybrid

Season: Mid-January-March

Peel: Bumpy rind, easy to peel, bell shape (but not always).

Inside: Flesh is yellow-orange, very juicy, sweet, and tangy

Tangerines (S) (Seeds)

Season: November through May

Peel: Smooth and thin, loose fitting and easy to peel.

Inside: Deep orange with some seeds. Sweet.

Holiday Golds (HG) (Few seeds)

Season: December through January Peel: Smooth, bright golden color. Inside: Orange-rich taste and aroma with a juicy, concentrated flavor, easy to peel,

Temple (T) (Seeds)

Season: February Peel: Pebbled with deep orange-red color, easy to peel. Inside: Light orange, some seeds. Subtle 'spicy' flavor with intense fragrance.

Cara Cara Navel Orange (F) (Usually 6 seeds or less)

Season: Late January through spring. Peel: Similar to the Grove Navel Inside: Deep red flesh, abundant juice, sweet with few seeds if any.

Honeybelles -AKA Minneola (C) Spring Variety (Few seeds)

Season: Mid-Feb - Apr Peel: Easy to peel, bell shaped. Inside: Yellowish orange, sweet and slightly tangy

*According to the USDA, a seedless orange contains six or fewer seeds. Most Navel varieties are considered seedless.
